

Miniature Daffodil Cultivars

“Miniature Daffodil Cultivars” is furnished to you on the accompanying CD (compact disc). It is a compilation of the images from various sources and serves as a photographic reference. There are five files on the disc. All are portable document format (PDF) files. The files with names ending in “ManAdv.pdf” allow you to advance manually from slide to slide. The files with names ending in “AutoAdv.pdf” will advance automatically from slide to slide when displayed with the Adobe Reader. The files with names starting with “Mini_Alpha” have the cultivars arranged in alphabetic order. The files with names starting with “Mini_Div” have the cultivars arranged by division. The file named “Mini_Notes.pdf” is this page of notes.

PDF files can be viewed on just about any computer and will look the same regardless of computer. PDF files also can be displayed without having to buy a special application. Apple Macintosh computers already come with an application named Preview that can view and print PDF files. Just double click on the files; no additional applications are needed, though you can download and install the free Adobe Reader for Macintosh if you wish. Users running Windows must install the free Adobe Reader. Many PC applications come with the user manual in the form of a PDF file and a copy of Adobe Reader on the installation CD. You may already have installed Adobe Reader on your PC. Often, manufacturers of desktop and laptop PC systems will pre-install the Adobe Reader along with Windows. If you do not have Reader, you can go to the Adobe web site and download Reader for free. There are also free versions of Reader for other UNIX operating systems (There is a UNIX system underlying Mac OS X).

Under Adobe Reader, the slide shows will open in full screen mode. For the manual advance versions use the arrow keys to advance or back up. Hit the Escape key to bring up the menu bar; this will put the slide in a window and allow you to choose other commands from the menu bar. If you use Preview on a Macintosh, the presentation opens with a menu bar and the slide in a window. To display slides in full screen mode, go to the View menu and pull down to the Slideshow option. Then click on the icon that looks like a rectangle with four arrows at the corners to stretch the slide to full screen. Clicking on the X icon or hitting the Escape key will take you back to the menu bar with the slide in a window.

You may copy the PDF files onto your hard drive and print additional copies of these notes. Please remember that the images are copyrighted by their photographers and the text by the ADS. As an individual, a garden club, or local daffodil society, you may make backup copies and add this CD to your library for repeat presentations, but you do not have the right without the permission of the copyright owners to duplicate and distribute these files or parts of these files to others.
